Message from the Principal

S.B.Deorah College, established in 1984 under the pioneering leadership of some visionaries of Ulubari area of Guwahati is a prominent seat of higher learning in the North East. Here, we strive to impart quality education to the learners who come from various parts of the region. We also try to imbibe the core values of life to the students so that they become good human beings and good citizens.

We have been providing conventional Arts and Commerce education in all these years. In 2018-19 session, we started BSc at undergraduate level. There is a growing demand for higher education facilities in the science stream and we believe that our endeavour will be able to cater the need to some extent. One of our priority areas is development of skills among the students and we aspire to introduce some vocational and job-oriented courses in the near future. The introduction of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) by Gauhati University at UG level in 2019-20 will go a long way in this regard.

Centrally located in the city of Guwahati, we have very good infrastructure in the campus. We have built a digital smart classroom cum conference room with video conferencing facility. Our science laboratories are also state-of-the-art and probably best in the town. Our library is fully computerized and we provide unlimited broadband and wi-fi internet connectivity to the students as well as faculty. We also have a well-equipped and fully furnished Girls' Hostel in the campus. With grants received from RUSA, the entire College buildings are renovated. We have also installed a 25 Kw solar power plant in the campus and thus turned ourselves from consumer to a producer and supplier of Green energy. The first two floors of our New Academic Building, constructed with partial grants from RUSA and State Govt., are ready. Apart from three new classrooms, Girls Common Room will be housed in the ground floor. The College library will be shifted to the entire first floor of the new building. During the last year, the entire front side of the College is covered with pavers block.

Maintenance of discipline, punctuality and regularity is top priority of this institution. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College takes care of improving quality and suggests measures for overall development of the College. In November 2015, NAAC re-accredited our College and we secured 'B' Grade with CGPA of 2.46. In 2019-20, we applied for NIRF 2020 and pleased that our College is listed under NIRF too. We are trying to our level best to provide best of facilities and qualities to the students. During the COVID 19 pandemic, we introduced online classes for the students and we hope to continue it even after the Colleges are re-opened along with the traditional offline mode. We have also uploaded many study materials and Class videos and audios in our online portal for the benefit of the students. We can assure that after passing out, our students will fondly remember the College and call themselves a proud alumnus of this institution.

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A brief history :

Sreenivas Basudev Deorah College, popularly referred to as S.B.Deorah College, nestles in an ideal location in the arterial G.S.Road of Guwahati. Formerly named, Ulubari College, this institution started functioning in the premises of the neighbouring Ulubari High School in the evening on 9th September 1984 with 75 students in its roll for the higher secondary programme.

The College has been set up with the painstaking efforts of a few academically conscious personalities who felt the need of an institution of higher education in the Ulubari locality. Late Chidananda Das, former Registrar of Gauhati University, was the founder President of the Steering Committee of the College. On 9th September 1987, the college started functioning from its own temporary Assam-type shed. It was upgraded to the status of Degree College in the same year.

At a public meeting held on 4th November 1989, it was decided to entrust S.B.Deorah Charitable Trust to construct a two storeyed R.C.C building with a plinth area of 9000 sq. feet for the college. Accordingly the building was constructed providing the required infrastructure for all administrative work, teaching-learning and co-curricular activities. In recognition to the contribution of the trust, the Ulubari College Authority renamed the college after Sreenivas Basudev Deorah as S.B.Deorah College.

The college is affiliated to the Gauhati University and came under the deficit grant-in-aid schemes of Government of Assam on 11th January 1996. It has attained permanent UGC registration under Section 2(f) & 12 (B) of UGC Act, 1956, in the year 2005.

The college has remained tall and strong for 35 years since its inception moving from strength to strength. It stands as an emblem of knowledge and wisdom where the students are nurtured to be better individuals and to be useful members of society. An efficient and firm administration along with a team of dedicated and sincere faculty members are committed to the goal of providing quality education and creating a harmonious and healthy environment making the students self-sufficient and instilling in them the confidence to realize their dreams.

Courses of study and number of seats in each course

The college offers two year Higher Secondary Course under AHSEC and three year degree course in Arts, Science and Commerce under Gauhati University. Students securing less than 40% in HSLC Examination will not be given admission in general category in H.S Arts and Commerce course.

ADOPTION OF CBCS BY GU AT UG LEVEL

Gauhati University has decided to adopt Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) at the Undergraduate Level from the Academic Session 2019-20. This internationally recognised system is more students centric and has several advantages over the previous system. UGC recommended this system in 2015 to usher in a paradigm shift in higher education sector of the country. Under this system, students are given much wider choice of Courses and brought Ability Enhancement and Skill courses in the curriculum to be compulsorily studied by all the undergraduate students. The system is also very flexible in the sense that it allows students to choose inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary courses as well as it permits students mobility to other institutions. The system also calls for adoption of a uniform grading system by the Universities across the Country. Courses and Credits under CBCS: Credit indicates hours of instruction. 1 credit is equivalent to one hour of classroom instruction for theory classes and 2 hours of instructions in practical classes. Under CBCS, the Courses and their respective credits are shown below:

1. **Core Course:** These are discipline specific compulsory papers to be studied by the students. The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities. All the papers under this category will carry 6 credits each.
2. **Elective Course:** Two types of elective courses are included under CBCS.
 - i) **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses:** These elective papers are related to the Core disciplines chosen by the students. Students will have to select the required number of DSE papers from among the choices available in an institute. These courses/papers will have 6 credits each.
 - ii) **Generic Elective (GE) Courses:** Students will have to choose these elective papers which are not related to their core discipline(s). This will give the students exposure beyond their main discipline of choice. These papers will also have 6 credits each.
3. **Ability Enhancement Courses:** These Courses are aimed at increasing ability and skills of the students to enhance their employability. There are two components-
 - i) **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** All the students will have to study two courses/papers carrying 4 credits each.
 - a) English/MIL Communication;
 - b) Environmental Studies.
 - ii) **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** The students will have choice of selecting the required Skill courses based on their interest from the pool of the courses offered by the Institute. These courses will have 4 credits each.

Requirement of Courses and Credits for a UG degree: Under CBCS, the UG degrees will be called Honours and Regular instead of Major and General in the previous system. The minimum requirement courses and credits for an UG Honours or Regular degree is indicated below:

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❑ Registration and Admission will be only on online mode. Students seeking admission should register in the admission portal www.sbdeorahonline.in
- ❑ Registration fees will be Rs. 300/-. However, registration and admission into HS first year (Arts) and BA first year will be free of cost for students belonging to the domicile State of Assam as per Govt. direction.
- ❑ Registration for admission to the college must be done by filling all the mandatory fields in the admission portal.
- ❑ For those who are required to pay Registration fees will have to deposit the same through online mode provided in the portal.
- ❑ Students will be selected strictly on the basis of merit. Admission procedure is governed by the college admission rules and the decision taken by the Principal will be treated as the final.
- ❑ The college follows the reservation policy as per Govt. of Assam norms.
- ❑ Request/pressure for admission from any quarters will not be entertained under any circumstances.
- ❑ Students who passed the qualifying examination in the earlier year(s) will have to submit an authentic gap certificate issued by a competent authority.
- ❑ Students once admitted will not be permitted local transfer.

- ❑ Students selected for admission must get themselves admitted within the stipulated date, failing which they will forfeit their seats.
- ❑ Admission to the College Girls' Hostel will be made on merit basis.
- ❑ Documents such as Marksheet, Age proof, Domicile certificate, Caste certificate, Bank document and Photograph and Signature are to be uploaded while filling up the online Application form. Originals of the certificates and documents will

SEMESTER SCHEDULE AND EXAMINATIONS UNDER GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

First, Third and Fifth Semester (Including Examinations) : August 1 – December 23, 2020

Second, Fourth, and Sixth Semester (Including Examinations) : January 18 – June 30, 2021

Semester Break : July 1 – July 31, 2021

Winter Break : December 24, 2020- January 17, 2021

A student's performance shall be monitored by the teachers throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the written and practical works. Evaluation in each written and practical paper will be as follows:

External Evaluation : 80% Marks (Conducted by Gauhati University)

Internal Evaluation : 20% Marks (Includes one sessional examination)

External Evaluation : External Evaluation shall be through a final examination at the end of the semester. The pass marks on each written paper is 30% and in each practical paper is 40%. To pass in a paper a students must secure pass marks in both sessional and final examination separately. Further, without 75% attendance in classes a student will not be allowed to sit either in sessional or in main examination.

Internal Evaluation(I.E.): As per the TDC regulation adopted by Gauhati University in October 2017, the following criteria will be applied

- ❖ Sessional examination will comprise of 50% of the total marks earmarked for Internal Evaluation. (For example, if total marks for Internal Evaluation is 20, then 10 marks will be from sessional examination)
- ❖ 20% of the marks allotted for I.E. will be from class attendance. (For example if total marks for I.E. is 20, then 4 marks will be allotted based on class attendance as follows :
 - (i) Class attendance from 76% to 80% - 1 Mark
 - (ii) Class Attendance from 81% to 85% - 2 Marks
 - (iii) Class Attendance from 86% to 90% - 3 Marks
 - (iv) Class Attendance from 91% and above -4 Marks
- ❖ Rest 30% of the marks allotted for I.E. will be distributed and awarded on the basis of performance of the students on (i) Home assignment (ii) Seminar/Group Discussion (iii) Field work, (iv) Performance in co-curricular & extra-curricular activities.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICES**College Library:**

The College has a well managed, well stocked, and fully computerized central library having more than 15000 collections of text and reference books. Latest publications in the field of Economics, Education, Political Science, History, Philosophy, Literature, Commerce, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Statistics etc. are continuously added to the collection. Besides books, the Library also subscribes to a good number of periodicals and research journals pertaining to different subjects taught in the college. Popular magazines, various daily and weekly regional & national newspapers etc are also available in the reading room of the library. It also has a humble collection of digital resources in the form of CD-ROM, DVD-ROM.

The entire collection of the library have been converted into machine readable form using a sophisticated library management software SOUL 2.0, developed by the INFLIBNET Centre, an autonomous body of the UGC. The library is fully automated providing various housekeeping services to the users using computers such as automated issue & return of



Books, access to online catalogues (OPAC), information retrieval using Boolean search operators, author, title, subject searching, database searching, bibliographic services, access to serial database etc. Besides, the library also provides Internet facility over a number of networked computers through LAN to the users of the library for accessing various learning resources on Internet.

The library has the facility to access various online e-resources through a UGC sponsored consortia viz. N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content). Users of our library can



access more than 5,000 online e-journals, more than 74,000 e-books covering a wide range of subjects in the field of social science, science & humanity. The library has also developed a digital library (Institutional Digital Repository) using Dspace there institutional publication as well previous question papers of GU are digitised & made available for use by - the students & faculty member of the college.

The library also maintains a Book Bank Cell which has text book for the benefits of students belonging to economically weaker sections of the society. These books are issued for a full session to the bonafide students of the college. The library is also organizing user orientation programme for the freshers in order to make them familiar into the library systems and procedures.

Scholarship & Incentives

Besides the scholarship provided by the State Government, the college authority has also announced some new schemes of scholarship for the students from the academic session 2003-04. Two scholarship in the name of the former President of Governing Body Late Pratap Ch. Deka and his wife Late Kunjalata Deka are given to the students who secure the highest marks in TDC and H.S. Final Examination. Moreover, the college authority also provides scholarships to the students who secure 55% or more mark in the Major Courses of the TDC – I, TDC – II, and TDC – III year examination and also for the students of General Course who secure 1st Division in the TDC Final Examination.

Late Ashok Kumar Deorah- Faith, Diligence & Stoic Scholarship-From the session 2016-17 a new scholarship in the name of Late Ashok Kumar Deorah-Faith, Diligence & Stoic Scholarship, sponsored by Mr. Amrit Deorah, Proprietor of Ashroy Concept Foods, has been introduced. Under this Mr. Deorah has offered to contribute Rs. 1.0 Lakh every year to be distributed among needy and meritorious students of the College.

Girls' Hostel

The S.B.Deorah College Women's Hostel is situated within the college campus which is under the supervision of Hostel Supervision Committee. The hostel is a 3 storeyed R.C.C. building with residential complex for the Hostel Superintendent and the support staff. It has well furnished spacious and well-lit rooms. The food catered is hygienically prepared and nutritious. Facilities like newspapers, indoor games and a television set are also provided. At present the hostel accommodates 30 boarders who are given admission strictly on merit. The supervision and care of the boarders is looked after by the Hostel Superintendent along with the internal management of the hostel.

IQAC:

IQAC is an important organ of the college. It has been working as per guidelines of NAAC. The IQAC prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQARs) of the college. The IQAC suggest measures for overall development and particularly improvement of academic environment of college. The IQAC also co-ordinates the works of various cells and sub-committees of the college. Dr. Anjali Patowary, Associate professor of History, is the present co-ordinator of IQAC.

Career Guidance and Counseling Cell

The Cell tries to create awareness regarding career prospects, self employment, and entrepreneurship development among the students and helps the students in finding and selecting various channels of employment opportunities. The Cell organizes career related seminar, talks etc. on regular basis for the benefits of the students by inviting competent persons.

Remedial and Tutorial Classes

The College has made provision for remedial classes for providing academic assistance to needy students within the college hours.

Coaching Classes for Entry into Services

The College has made provision for providing coaching for entry into services for Degree students by experts as well as college faculty.

Canteen

The Canteen of the College has been serving the students with healthy snacks at subsidized price.

Grievance and Redressal Cell

There is a Grievance and Redressal Cell in the College to receive the grievances of the students. The college has also introduced a Students' Feed Back system to assess the teaching learning procedures. Students can collect the feed back forms from the Grievance and Redressal Cell and can submit the same in the box specified for the said purpose.

Extension Education Cell

The College has constituted an Extension Education Cell which aims to implement some community oriented programmes like literacy campaigning, health awareness programmes, cultural and personality development programmes etc. for the welfare of the various sections of the society.

Health Care Cell

The Health Care Cell of the College organizes free health check-ups every year for the students of the college. It also organises seminars and lectures on health issues.

Women Cell

The Women Cell of the College works for the general welfare and safety of the girl students. Generation of awareness on gender specific issues through various workshops and seminars is also one of its

foremost concerns. Building a gender friendly atmosphere where girl students can engage in academic pursuit is the avowed mission of the Cell.

Students' Union

The S.B.Deorah College Students Union is the General Body of the students of the college. Its function is subject to the guidance and control of the college authority. Its membership is compulsory for every student. Its office bearers are elected annually. The election will be conducted as per direction of Lyngdoh Committee recommendations.

Students' Election:

Election to the Students' Union are held as per Lyngdoh Committee recommendations. Students whose class attendances are less than 75% cannot contest in the Students' Election.

Alumni Association

The College has an alumni association with its office in the college campus. The College appeals to all ex-students to join the Alumni Association and keep in touch with the office bearers.

Students' Welfare Cell

The Cell offers financial aid to meritorious cum economically challenged students in the form of providing text books, exemption of tuition fees etc. Besides, talented students excelling in extra-curricular activities will also be offered aid. The Cell also offers counselling to students to find solutions to their problems.

Internet and Photocopy Facility

Unlimited Internet access and photocopy facility is available for the students in the College Library

Auditorium

The College has a spacious auditorium of seating capacity of 750 persons with a permanent stage for performing various academic and cultural activities.

Digital Classroom with Video-Conferencing Facility

The College possesses a Digital classroom with modern equipments to make the teaching-learning process more interactive.

ACADEMIC & CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:**Unit Test and Annual Examination**

A Unit Test of 50 marks in each subject (for higher secondary students) will be held during the session. Students failing to appear in the unit test without a valid reason will have to pay a penalty fine to be fixed by the authority. Annual examination for HS 1st year will be held during Feb-March 2020.

Seminars and Workshops

Seminars and Workshops, which are integral part of the teaching learning process, are held by the departments at regular intervals. Multi disciplinary seminars are also held in the college and scholars from various fields are invited.

Educational Tour

Various Departments of the College organize educational tours with a view to expose our students with cultures, history,



geography, and also to familiarize them with the flora and fauna of the country.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Discipline Among the Students

The students are expected to maintain high standard of discipline. They must abide by the rules and regulations of the college authority. Violation of rules may make a student liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer, and even expulsion from the college. Any willful damage or theft of college property will be treated as serious offence and will be dealt sternly.

Attendance

Students must be regular and punctual in attending their classes. It is to be noted that at least 75% attendance is essential for appearing in Council and University exam failing which he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. A non-collegiate student will be debarred from appearing in sessional examinations. A student failing to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes will forfeit his/her seat.

College Uniform

It is mandatory for all students to use the standard prescribed college uniform. Students who are not wearing proper uniform will be refused entry into the college campus. The details of the outlets from where the uniform can be purchased will be given on the day of the admission.

College Identity Card

A non-transferable Identity Card will be issued to all students. Students must carry their identity card at all the times inside the college premises and must be produced whenever demanded.

Ragging

Ragging in any form inside the college premises and in the women's hostel is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in Ragging will be punished severely as per the existing directives of the Supreme Court/High Court.

Cleanliness

Cleanliness of the college premises must be maintained at all cost. Wastes should be disposed off in the waste bins kept for the purpose. Writing and sticking of Bills on the walls is strictly prohibited. Spitting is strictly prohibited. Enmasse fine will be imposed on the offenders.

Tobacco Chewing

Smoking or chewing of tobacco, pan masala and gutkha in the campus is strictly banned as per Govt. order. Anyone found even in possession will be expelled from the College.

Use of mobile phones in the college campus is highly restricted.
